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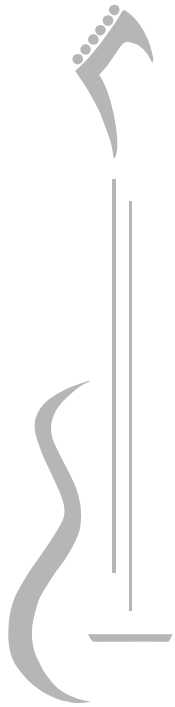
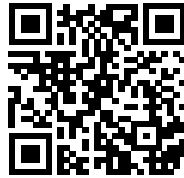

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HOW TO POSITION YOUR **CHORD HAND**

Here is the simplest and best way to position your chord hand every time:

- 1 Tilt your guitar
- 2 Position your thumb
- 3 Then position your fingers

This simple approach makes it much easier to learn guitar chords.

And it's easier to speed up your chord changing too, which is the great secret of playing guitar.



Thumb first - Then fingers

1 TILT YOUR GUITAR

Tilting makes learning chords so much easier. The guitar is now doing some of the work for you. It also helps to produce a good sound.



2 POSITION YOUR THUMB

Thumb on top for open chords

Thumb low and centred for barre chords



3 POSITION YOUR FINGERS

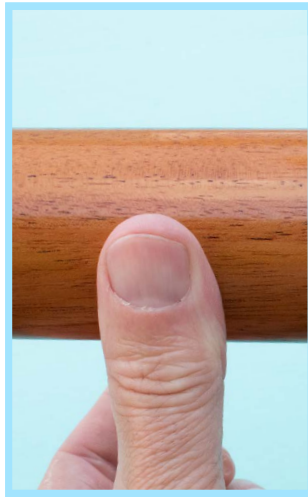
The simple 3 step approach here is technically perfect and exactly as played by top guitarists.

It can help you achieve in weeks, what many people took years to learn.

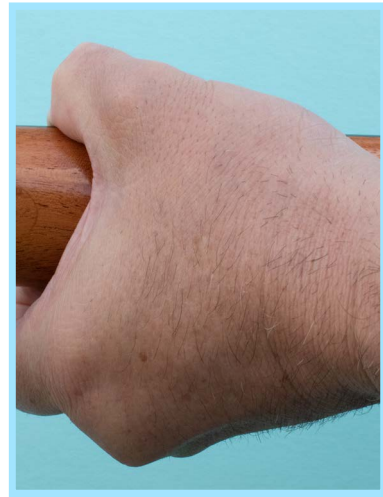

THE SECRET


Here is one of the great secrets of playing guitar. In fact without it, nothing is possible.

If you watch any great guitarist, in any style of music, anywhere in the world you'll see **"The Guitar Triangle"**.

- 1** Makes room for fingers to move
- 2** Lets you play with your fingertips
- 3** Prevents knuckles from collapsing
- 4** Makes chord changing easier

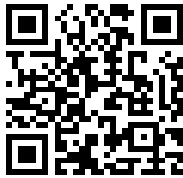
HOW TO READ **CHORD DIAGRAMS**

Chord diagrams are hugely helpful if you're an experienced guitarist. But because they only show you the front of the guitar neck, they do not work for most beginners.

However, if you're a beginner the secret is to combine **"The 3 Step Approach"** with the chord diagram.

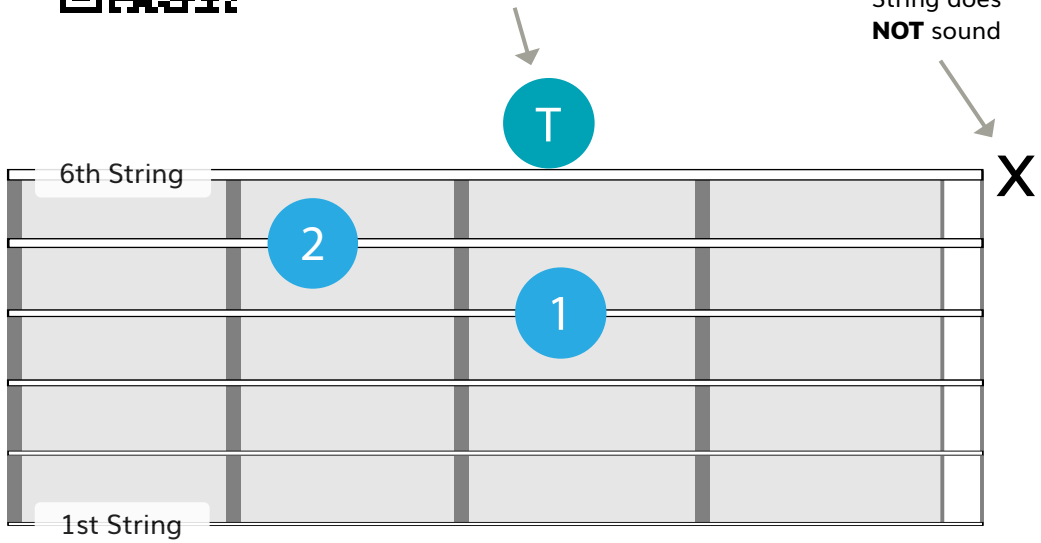
Now they're much easier to follow - and save you time.

- T** Thumb
- 1** 1st Finger
- 2** 2nd Finger
- 3** 3rd Finger
- 4** 4th Finger

String does **NOT** sound

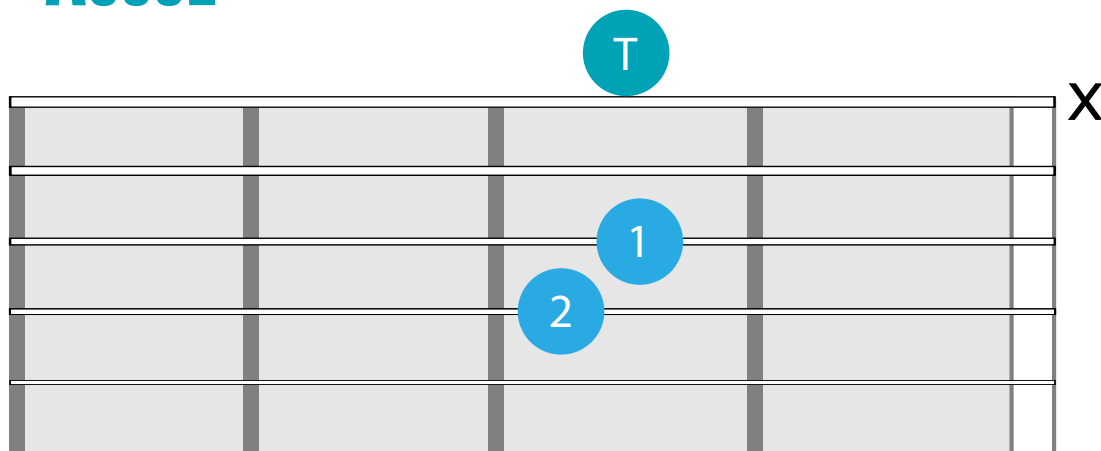

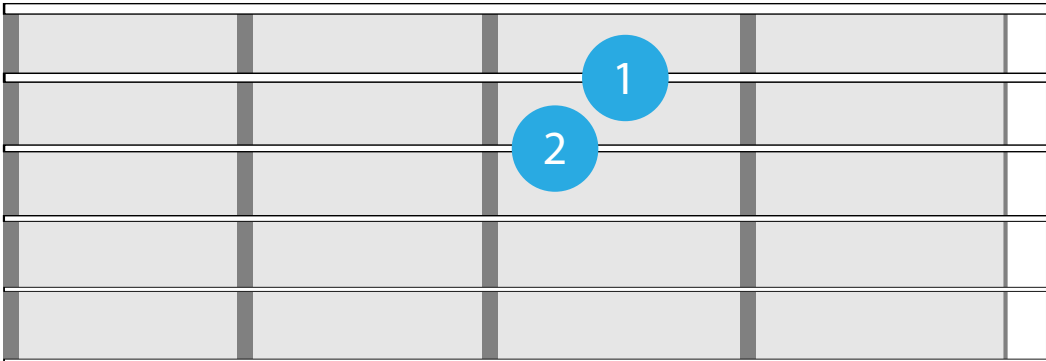


- Thumb touching 6th string

- Strum 6 strings - Only 5 sound

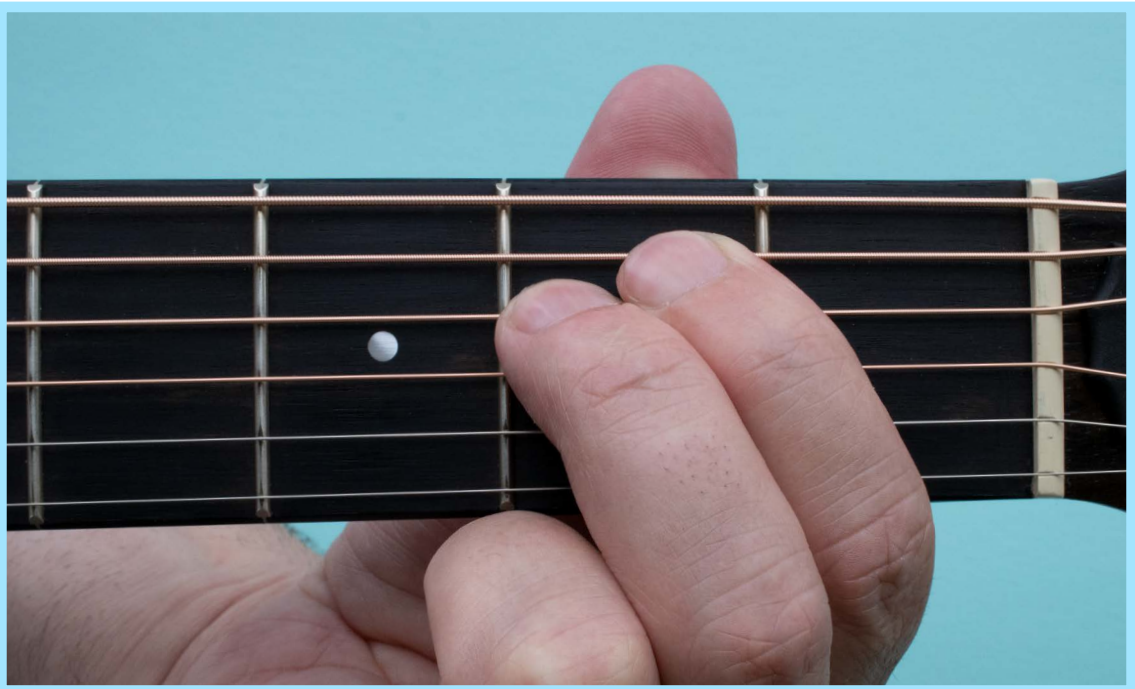
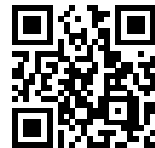


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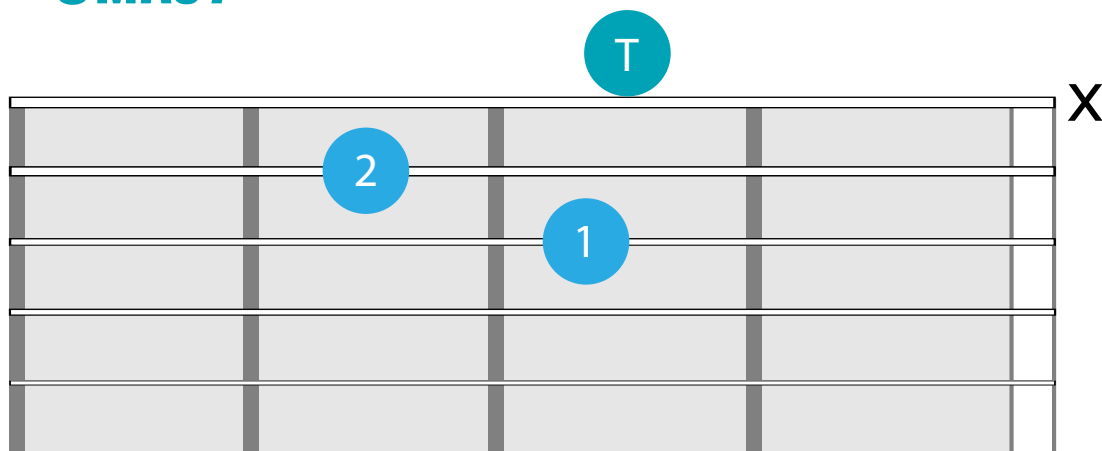

- All 6 strings sound



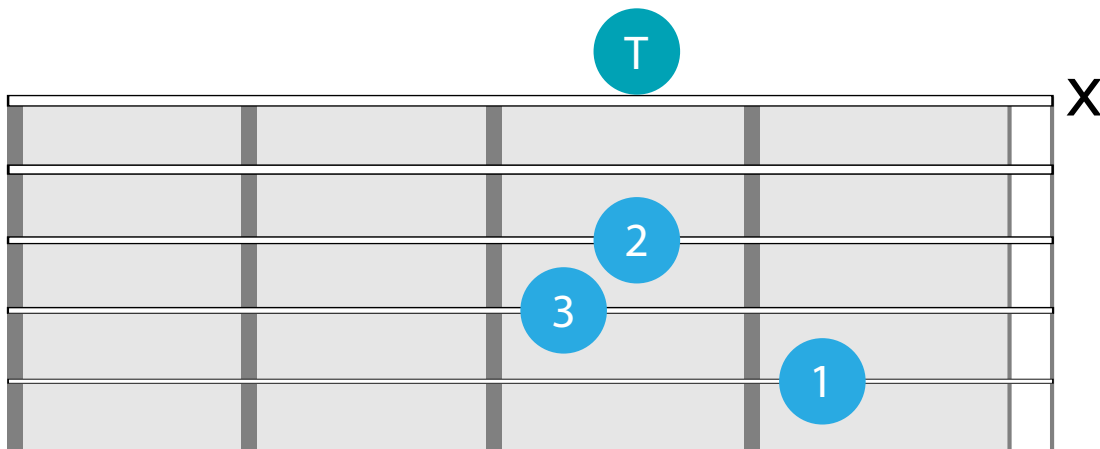
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- Thumb touching 6th string

- Strum 6 strings - Only 5 sound

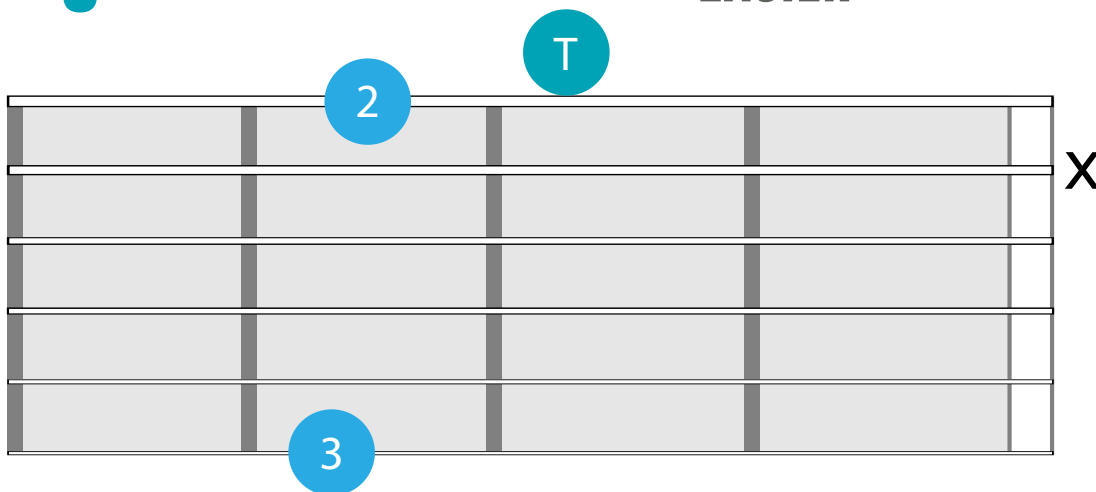

- 1st finger in corner of fret
- Strum 6 strings - Only 5 sound

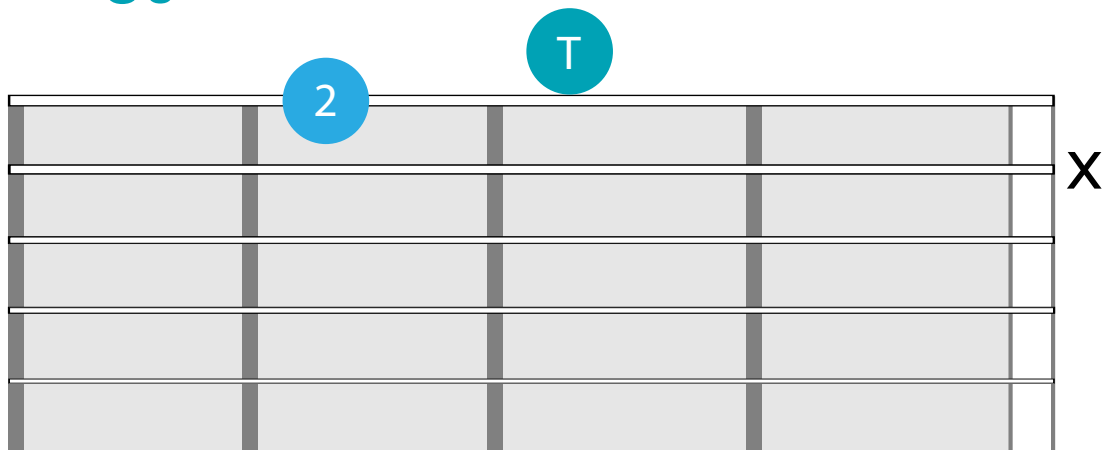


G**EASIER**

- 5th string muted by inside of 2nd finger
- Strum 6 strings - Only 5 sound



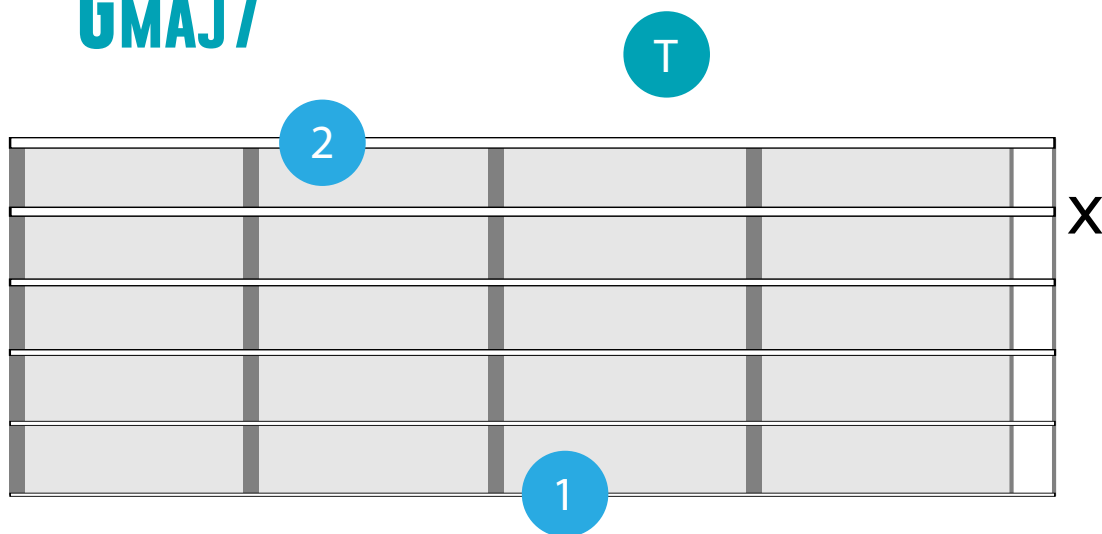

- Strum 6 strings - Only 5 sound

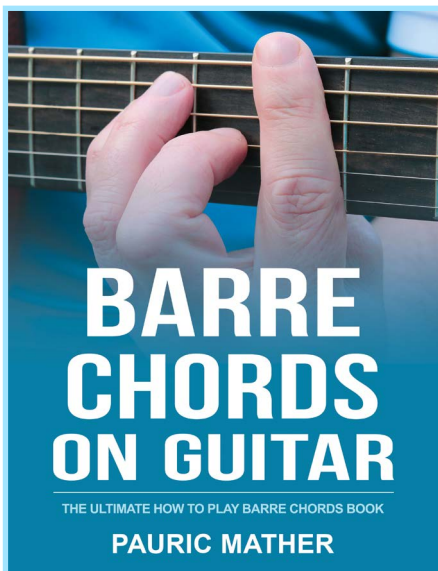
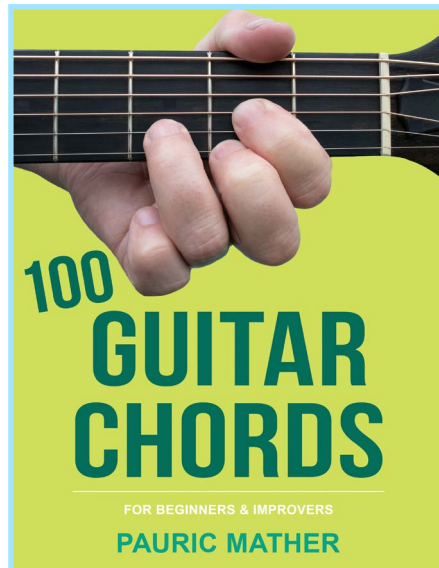
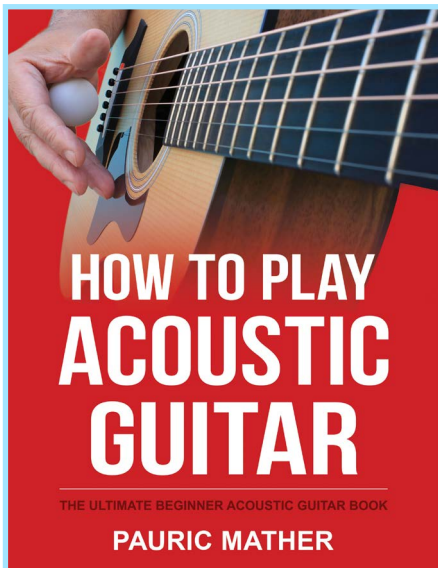
